

Fursey Pulpit Fall and Dedication Saturday 6th October 2012

The design of the Fall is based on our <u>Fursey Pilgrims</u> <u>logo</u>. This is an equal-armed cross set against the background of a scallop shell, the symbol of Pilgrimage. Each arm is formed using the <u>Triquetra</u> symbol representing the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. The Fursey Fall was the work of Fursey Pilgrim Philippa Sims. Of her work she said:

'The Fursey Fall was hand embroidered on Irish linen. The pilgrims' shell is of <u>sateen</u> and forms a background to the everlasting paths to and from God, which were sewn in chain stitch using <u>DMC</u> threads of naturalistic colours, similar to those used in Celtic writings. The paths lead to a gold boss at the centre of the Cross which was sewn in <u>couched-down</u> gold thread. The Fursey name was sewn in <u>satin stitch</u> using DMC thread'.
